Known for her warmth, passion and vision in the wedding and event industry, Kitzia Morales shares in this interview her personal and charming perspective on holiday traditions and year-end celebrations.

1. What is your favorite Christmas tradition?

"Being with my son, no matter where or how. That's what I enjoy most about Christmas."

2. Do you prefer a snowy or beachy Christmas?

"Although I live in the tropics, I am fascinated by the magic of winter with snow."

3. What dish can't be missing on your Christmas table?

"I come from a very traditional family where turkey, leg and cod were essential. However, I've spent many Christmases around tables in different parts of the world, and what really matters to me is not the dish, but the company."

4. How do you decorate your home for the holidays?

"With 100% sustainable decoration, using local elements such as sisal and tropical plants. And, of course, there is never a lack of nativity."





5. Are you a Christmas movie marathon kind of person? Do you have a favorite?

"I love the Home Alone movies! They always make me laugh."

6. What would you include in a themed wedding for these dates?

"Skiing, without a doubt. It's my favorite sport, and if I had the chance, I would organize a mountain wedding, with snow, champagne, skis and friends. The perfect Christmas touch would be a mistletoe for the bride and groom to kiss under."

7. What advice would you give to those organizing weddings in December?

"They should consider the comfort of the guests regarding the temperature. If it is outdoors, include heaters and suggest appropriate clothing. I would also recommend hot aromatic beverages such as teas and punches, and use aromatherapy with notes of cinnamon and apple to enhance the ambiance."



8. How does the IADWP team celebrate the holidays?

"We always change. From taquiza to dance classes followed by a fun night out. This year, we'll probably try our luck with golf. The important thing is to keep the atmosphere relaxed and lively."

9. What Christmas trends would you highlight for events and weddings this year?

"Back to basics: celebrating as a family, valuing being, and being more than pretending. I also highlight shared tables, traditional dishes that evoke memories, and colors inspired by gold, frankincense and myrrh: coppers, golds and brown tones."

10. How do you usually say goodbye to the year and do you have any special rituals?

"I recently started a tradition I love: a multigenerational, multi-ethnic, totally informal party. Everyone is welcome: friends, parents of friends, my son's friends, and even some of my siblings."



11. If you could make one wish for the wedding and event industry in the coming year, what would it be?

"I would ask for both professionals and clients to be more conscientious and friendly. And that all couples can enjoy the wedding of their dreams without stress and frustration."

12. Do you have any amulet or tradition to attract good luck in the New Year?

"No! Neither moving suitcases, because I travel enough, nor red thongs because I don't like them (laughs)."

13. What would be a personal goal for the coming year?

"My goal would be to organize more sustainable events that benefit the communities where they are held."

14. What Christmas or New Year's song always puts you in a good mood?

"Campanas de Belén. It's impossible not to feel happy when you hear it."

15. What is your message to close the year 2024?

"Enjoy and be grateful for all that this year gave you. Receive 2025 with admiration and gratitude. May it be a year full of blessings for all!"

1. Choose a theme

The New Year's Eve dinner is one of the most special moments of the year. Not only is it an opportunity to gather with loved ones, but also to enjoy a delicious meal that marks the closing of a cycle and the beginning of a new one. Choosing the ideal menu for this occasion can be a challenge, since it is about satisfying the tastes and expectations of all diners, while maintaining a festive and unique air. Here are some tips and recommendations to achieve a memorable dinner without getting too complicated.

Consider the number of guests.

The number of guests is one of the first factors to consider. If you are organizing an intimate dinner with few guests, you can opt for more elaborate menus or individual dishes. However, if your celebration will be with a large number of people, the key will be to choose dishes that can be served easily and quickly, and that are suitable to prepare in large quantities without losing quality.



Choose the type of menu.

For a New Year's Eve dinner, menus that include appetizers, main course and dessert, accompanied by a special drink, such as cocktails or a good wine, are generally preferred. Below we suggest some options based on traditional Costa Rican dishes.

Appetizers

Fish Ceviche.

Ceviche is one of the most representative dishes of Costa Rica, ideal to start a light and fresh dinner. It is prepared with fresh fish (usually corvina *otilapia*), marinated in lime juice, red onion, cilantro, hot bell pepper and cucumber. Costa Rican ceviche is usually served with crackers or totopos (corn chips).

Chicken Tamales.

Tamales are a classic of Costa Rican gastronomy, especially at New Year's Eve and Christmas celebrations. They are prepared with corn dough filled with chicken, pork or vegetables, wrapped in banana leaves and steamed. They are an excellent option to offer as a starter, since they are easy to eat and very tasty.

Palm Heart Salad

Palm heart, which comes from the heart of the palm tree, is a widely used ingredient in Costa Rica and can be prepared in several ways. A fresh palm heart salad with tomato, onion, cilantro, lime juice and a touch of olive oil is a light and tasty starter to whet the appetite.



Main Course

Arroz con Pollo (Chicken and Rice).

Arroz con pollo is one of the most traditional and beloved dishes in Costa Rica, perfect for a family dinner or celebration. Rice is cooked with pieces of chicken, vegetables (such as carrots, potatoes, peas and peppers), and seasoned with a mixture of Costa Rican spices such as achiote. The rice takes on a golden color and a delicious flavor that is very characteristic of Costa Rican cuisine.

Grilled Chicken Breast with Tamarind Sauce.

For a more sophisticated option, grilled chicken breast with tamarind sauce is an excellent choice. Tamarind, which is very common in the region, provides a sweet and sour flavor that combines perfectly with the chicken meat. You can accompany it with a side of mashed potatoes or white rice.

Carne Enrollada (Meat Roll).

This dish is very traditional in Costa Rican celebrations. It is a cut of beef stuffed with carrots, onions, potatoes and sometimes bacon. It is then baked or cooked in tomato sauce with spices. It is ideal for a special occasion, as it is a recipe that, although it takes time to prepare, tastes incredibly delicious.

Desserts

Tres Leches (Cake).

This cake is a classic dessert of the region, and cannot be missed in a Costa Rican New Year's Eve celebration. This cake is soft and fluffy, bathed in a mixture of three types of milk (evaporated milk, condensed milk and cream), which makes it a juicy and delicious dessert. It is garnished with whipped cream and often with a touch of cinnamon.

Cacao Cake or Chocolate Tico.

Chocolate is another highly appreciated ingredient in Costa Rican gastronomy. Cocoa cake, or simply chocolate cake, is a simple but tasty dessert that can be served with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream. Costa Rican cocoa is of excellent quality, making this dessert very representative of the region.

Coconut Cajeta.

Coconut cajeta is a very popular sweet in Costa Rica, especially on special occasions. It is a mixture of condensed milk, sugar and grated coconut that is cooked until a thick and sticky texture is obtained. You can serve it in small portions or with corn cookies.

Drinks.

Guaro Sour:

A cocktail based on guaro, the traditional Costa Rican liquor, with lemon juice, sugar and ice. Refreshing and perfect for a toast.

Costa Rican Coffee:

If you prefer something milder, Costa Rican coffee is an excellent option to finish the meal. Costa Rica is famous for its high quality coffee, and there is no better way to end a meal than with a cup of this delicious brew.

Incorporate seasonal ingredients.

Winter brings with it a variety of fresh and flavorful ingredients that can add a special touch to your menu. Fruits such as apples, pears and pomegranates, vegetables such as squash, artichokes and leeks, and spices such as cinnamon, cloves and ginger are perfect for this time of year.

Balance of flavors.

When choosing the menu, it is essential to balance the flavors. Not everything should be heavy or too sweet; alternating between salty, sour, sweet and bitter flavors will make the dining experience more interesting. Think of dishes with different textures and colors so that each bite is a surprise.



Choose appropriate beverages.

Drinks play a key role in a New Year's Eve celebration. Wine and champagne are traditional, but you can also offer a variety of non-alcoholic cocktails and soft drinks for those who prefer not to consume alcohol. Some festive drinks such as a fruit punch, apple cinnamon cocktails, or even a sparkling cider can be delicious options.

Make it easy for you, but special for them.

Not everything has to be elaborate or extremely complicated. You can make dinner spectacular without spending too much time in the kitchen. Opting for dishes that can be prepared ahead of time can reduce the stress of the day of the dinner.

Decorate and present the dishes properly

Presentation is also important. Although the food should be tasty, a well-decorated table and well-presented dishes can make even a simple menu look spectacular.

The ideal New Year's Eve dinner menu should be a mix of flavors, colors and textures that highlight the festivity of the occasion. With proper planning, you can offer a delicious and balanced meal, without forgetting those details that will make your dinner a real success. The most important thing is that each dish reflects your style and that all guests feel comfortable and well attended.

Remember that the key is in the organization: prepare in advance, choose dishes that can satisfy the tastes and needs of your guests, and don't forget to enjoy the process. Happy New Year and *bon appetit*!

Christmas in Panama is a holiday full of tradition, lots of joy and, of course, an excellent Panamanian gastronomy especially to share with family and friends that are never missing. And of course we always want to surprise each of our guests with a unique Christmas table. Here are some tips that will help you create an unforgettable experience, while maintaining the flavor and customs that characterize the Panamanian Christmas.


1. Preparing our traditional dishes is definitely personal.

Panamanian Christmas gastronomy is very special, with a mixture of native flavors and influences from many cultures. Some of those more traditional dishes that cannot be missing in our Christmas table are:

Panamanian Tamales: Prepared with corn, chicken or pork, and wrapped in banana leaves.

Stuffed Turkey: Turkey is the main dish in many tables, but in Panama it is prepared in the local way, with a delicious stuffing of raisins, olives, prunes and some include the famous aji *trompito*, rice, bread, wine, ham trimmings, nuts adorned some with pineapple.





Potato Salad, better known as Ensalada de Feria:

Although it is common in many parts of Latin America, in Panama it has a style, as it is accompanied by beets, unique, with mayonnaise, vegetables and a touch of paprika and aji *trompito*. **Rice with Guandú** cannot be missing in our Christmas table.

Saril (Hibiscus tea): it is very typical of Panamanian families... And of course you can not miss the ham, star of the Christmas menu. Its preparation is very simple. It includes mustard, cloves and a special glaze. The sauce is usually given a personal touch and a little bit of difference either with rum, and in other cases cane honey, pineapple juice, and peaches and decorate it with slices of pineapple. The fruit candy is the dessert of the Christmas menu, accompanied of course by Rum Punch. Our traditions and typical dishes reflect the richness and cultural diversity of our Christmas tables.

And of course, this Panamanian gastronomy must be accompanied by a good table. The decoration of the Christmas table is one of the most beautiful memories we can keep as a family.

Here are some tips that you can take into account to make a difference for our special guests. Among them we have the tablecloths and napkins of which regardless of the colors we have chosen for our Christmas should match and should reflect the elegance, personality that distinguishes them and go in harmony with the centerpieces. Candles give a touch of elegance to the table, as well as pine branches, nuts or flowers to give a Christmas touch. Of course, tableware and glassware should be selected with care; they should complement the aesthetics and beauty of your table. Remember to place cutlery from the outside in.

2. Some elements to consider: Tropical flowers:

Use flowers such as orchids, *plumerias* or palm leaves to decorate the center of the table. You can also include small coffee tree branches, which give a very special touch.





Paintings or figures of the "Diablicos Sucios":

In Panama, this is a popular figure at Christmas. Place small figures of the *diablicos* on the table as part of the centerpieces.

Glasses and plates in bright colors:

The typical colors for Christmas in Panama are usually red, green and gold, but you can also add touches of blue and white to make it much more vibrant.

Instead of using only white or red candles, try tropical colored candles or even scented candles with cinnamon or pineapple scents to make the table not only look pretty, but also smell delicious.

3. Surprise guests with Typical Beverages

Christmas drinks are another key aspect of the celebration in Panama. Make sure you have some original options for your guests to enjoy while waiting for the main course.

Rum Punch: A creamy and delicious cocktail served as a kind of punch, prepared with rum, condensed milk, eggs and nutmeg.

Panama Beer: Don't forget to include local beers, such as the famous Panama beer, for those who prefer a refreshing drink.

Tropical Fruit Refreshments: Offer natural juices from local fruits such as soursop, pineapple, or tamarind. Serve them in pitchers decorated with mint leaves or cinnamon sticks.

Prepare a beverage station with both alcoholic and non-alcoholic options, and accompany them with fresh fruits such as pineapple, coconut or papaya that, besides being tasty, add a tropical touch to your table.

4. Create an Interactive and Family Table

Panamanian Christmas is characterized as a celebration of family and community togetherness. Make sure your table invites conversation and sharing.

Buffet-style service: You can arrange the table in a buffet format, where guests can help themselves to portions of all the dishes, which encourages interaction and allows everyone to try a little bit of everything.

Cards with descriptions: If any of the dishes have a special touch or story behind them, create small cards to describe them. This can be a great way to educate the younger ones about local traditions.





Add a personalized touch to the table by placing small gifts or details for each guest, such as a mini bottle of rum or a package of homemade beignets as a gift to take home.

5. Christmas Music

To complete the experience, you can't miss the typical Christmas music. In Panama, decimas and Christmas carols are very popular, but especially Christmas salsa, to create a festive and joyful atmosphere.

Prepare a playlist with a mix of traditional and modern Christmas music to keep the mood lively. If you have musical instruments, invite your guests to join in and sing along! A Christmas karaoke is not to be missed and is the best time to make lasting memories.

6. Design Special Confirmation Cards



Christmas is not only a date, it is an experience full of emotions, memories and magic. For me, it is a reflection of what I love the most: celebrating life with the ones we love the most, taking care of every detail so that the result is unforgettable. As an Argentinean living in Santiago de Chile, mother of four and passionate about design and planning, I have learned that in events – as in life– the difference lies in the details.

My path as an event designer began in Milan in 2012, a city where I learned to transform elegance and creativity into art. Since then, every celebration I design carries a unique essence, created from the dreams of my clients. On this occasion, I want to share with you the most common mistakes when organizing a Christmas party and how you can avoid them to make this year as special as you imagine it to be.

1. Not setting a clear budget.

The enthusiasm to create a special celebration can lead to spending more than necessary, leaving out what is really important.





How to avoid it:

Set a budget and divide it according to your priorities: dining, decor, entertaining and finishing touches. Learn to balance quality and style to maximize every investment.

2. Planning on the fly

Lack of organization can lead to unnecessary stress and results that don't meet your expectations.

How to avoid it:

Plan at least one month in advance. This time will allow you to coordinate with suppliers, carefully choose the design of the event and anticipate any unforeseen events.

3. An unbalanced menu

Offering too many dishes is not only exhausting, but can overshadow gastronomic quality.

How to avoid it:

Select an elegant and well thought-out menu. At my events, I tend to incorporate modernity, highlighting quality ingredients. Add options that cater to the needs of all guests, such as vegetarian or gluten-free dishes.



4. Don't forget the children

The little ones are also part of the celebration, and their fun is essential for the success of the event.

How to avoid it:

Dedicate an exclusive space for them, with activities such as themed crafts, games or a Christmas movie area. This ensures that both they and their parents enjoy the evening.

5. Decoration without concept

A disorganized or excessive decoration can detract from the visual impact and generate disconnection in the environment.

How to avoid it:

Define a clear concept. At my events, I tend to draw inspiration from traditional palettes such as red, green and gold, or more contemporary designs that incorporate neutral tones with metallic touches. Adding natural elements, such as pine branches, scented candles and soft textures, elevates the sensory experience.

6. Ignoring the weather

An outdoor event can quickly become complicated if you are not prepared for a change in the weather.

How to avoid it:

Anticipate the unexpected. Always design a plan B that includes elegant tents, heaters or an indoor alternative that maintains the original aesthetics of the event.

7. Lack of entertainment

Adequate entertainment is the lifeblood of any celebration, and its absence can affect the atmosphere.



How to avoid it:

Include memorable experiences, such as interactive beverage stations, sophisticated gift exchanges or even live music. At every event I host, I prioritize moments that connect emotionally with attendees.

8. Underestimating the closing of the event.

Dismantling and cleanup can become chaotic if not planned as carefully as set-up.

How to avoid it:

Rely on a professional team to dismantle and clean up after the event. This will allow you to enjoy every last moment without worrying.







Make sure that the number of seats, bathrooms, furniture is adequate to what is planned. - **2. The entertainment is fundamental, it does not have to be very elaborate, but consistent with the group that will be sharing.

With a little planning and organization, Christmas can be a magical and stress-free time. Follow these tips and make the most of this celebration with your loved ones. Happy holidays!



Every season of the year and every celebration along our way gives us the opportunity to preserve, maintain and in many cases create spaces to enjoy the magic of them as a constant of life. We go at an accelerated pace and many times we feel that we lack hours in the day to meet the demands of our obligations: work, studies and commitments in general. The beautiful and admirable thing about human beings is their energy, the same energy they put into everything that has value for them and their loved ones.

Christmas is a special season in which we make our own illusions and traditions come true or those acquired over the years.

I could walk this path by taking you to traditions, rituals and beliefs of wonderful places in the world where this unique moment is lived in different ways.

But the intention is to give you the option to connect with your inner power through a sublime and subtle connection.





Smells, tastes, prayers, chants and energy are key words in some of our rituals.

We light candles, intend elements and make a ritual of ashes to transmute memories and past actions that we renounced to create new opportunities. We leave behind that which provided us with a life lesson because it is time to let go.

Spirituality is part of our divine connection that is linked to our human form and nature. By connecting with ourselves we will understand that deep desire to listen to ourselves and live in a more conscious way in gratitude and attunement with all that surrounds us.

Family traditions

As we travel through the world of traditions, there is a very significant one for families that is deeply rooted and celebrated prior to this time of the year: the Advent wreath, a symbol of infinite love, gratitude, family and fraternal union.

We can make our advent wreath with natural elements and personal taste following some guidelines:

It will be circular in shape to remind us of the promise that love is infinite and has no beginning and no end. It will have twigs and green leaves representing hope and life and 4 spaces suitable for a special color candle for each week before Christmas. They are lit for 4 Sundays, one at a time. It will regularly carry a red ribbon representing the metaphor of the first beings Adam and Eve.

When we are gathered around it, we pray or sing, since it is believed that whoever sings prays twice. We take the opportunity to thank and ask for blessings for the home and for the ones we love and also to remember the less favored and ask for them.

We do not intend to establish this tradition in you if it does not vibrate in your tune or is not one of your traditions. However, if you know it or do it, you will know that every Sunday when you light the corresponding candle, an atmosphere of hope and love is created in each member of the family that participates. Considering that nowadays there are few spaces in which we can focus to give ourselves a little peace and communication, it is valid to take it into account.

It takes place four weeks before Christmas Day.

Christmas is the central day after the well-known "Misa de Gallo" (Midnight Mass)

Group or individual tradition.

A journey into the interior and rituals

To start any ritual we always recommend a previous energetic cleansing, which can be simple and easy according to the power of

the intention, using elementals such as water, fire and sounds to detoxify our spaces and put them in harmony. It is proven that the intention we put in the previous acts to perform has the power to carry the information to our unconscious and materialize what we want, such as releasing contained or stagnant energies and fill us with peace, and materialize goals and life projections.

Archangels connect us with divine energy and manifest in our lives in special and wonderful ways. They give us messages and we can connect with their energy by performing a simple ritual for which we need incense or incense burners, some crystals or quartz, if they resonate with you, and a special candle in the color of the connecting archangel.





The space should be comfortable, calm, preferably with a subtle melody that invites meditation that leads us to calm our thoughts and connect with our inner self.

We will ask for guidance and protection, abundance and providence, inner peace and health.

They communicate through thoughts, numerological signs, sensations that are quite vivid, sometimes pleasant smells, or visual messages that take us to special memory spaces for each of us.

For communication with them we always have 7 archangels at our disposal:

Archangel Miguel, protection, blue color. Archangel Jofiel, wisdom and spirituality, yellow color. Archangel Chamuel, emotional strength and divine love, color Archangel Gabriel, divine communication, color white. Archangel Rafael, health and color Archangel healing, green. Uriel. transformation, color orange red. Zadquiel, Archangel forgiveness and compassion, color violet or purple.

This connection ritual can be performed individually or collectively with people who are in agreement with the moment, full of good intentions and goals to achieve. With the candle lit we visualize in a concrete way what we want to achieve, asking for the accompaniment and guidance of the chosen archangel, but not before having meditated and thanked in a conscious state everything that has been given to us.



This will lead us to a sense of evolution and peace that we can get used to. We will let the lit candle burn out and carry in its light that intention set at the beginning of our ritual that connects with the essence of the divine and universal energy. We will pay attention to the present moment and I assure you will have real messages from your archangel of protection.

Recommended for closing of the year or opening of cycles.

Ashes and closing of cycles

For this ritual you need a blue or violet candle, quartz such as tourmaline, white quartz or amethyst; elementals such as *palo santo*, rosemary, or sage; bells or bowls to create expansion through sound; sheets of paper and pencils of the color of your choice.

We start by lighting the candle and creating spaced but continuous sounds with the bells or the bowl.

The intention is to create a moment in which we connect with our journey during the present year and all that we have gone through until the day of the ritual. We must take the necessary time to allow ourselves to feel and express; we may have moments of nostalgia in the process, but they are completely valid: feel, express and let go. After clearly seeing what we want to transmute, we write, fold our leaves and proceed to burn it in the fire of our candle. If we do it alone or in a group, we will then light the elemental that we have chosen between the palo santo, rosemary or sage that will help us to center our being in the present. We will blow with the firm intention so that the smoke transports our desires, passing it through our head in a clockwise direction. We can do this ourselves or someone else can accompany us and be part of the process. Finally, as a meditation, we visualize those specific intentions for the new year.

We can deposit the ashes in a pot as fertilizer for the same. Let us trust in the power of transformation.

Recommended for birthdays, end of the year or closing of personal and process cycles.






Let us also remember that when we perform acts, such as preparing a cake, cookies, a punch or grandma's delicious chocolate, they will take us back to that moment of happiness and longing that does us so much good. They move us by bringing to the present traditions and memories that are worth the effort to keep alive and share with those we love.

When a tradition or ritual becomes part of our lives it helps us to root ourselves and live the present confident in the path we have set in our life projection. If we follow the divine guidance of the power that is faithfully within us, we can be sure that everything will flow in each of us.

Light and providence to all, Merry Christmas and an amazing New Year, may happiness always find us.



He defines himself as a storyteller and, as it is something he likes, here he wraps us in this story that will transport us to the fascinating world of cocktails.

"Autumn begins, the breezes that give way to the most joyful time of the year begin to be felt. It begins with the celebration of Thanksgiving and invites us to tune in to each of the privileges we enjoy."

"There's turkey, cranberry, cinnamon and pumpkin, and for those of us who live the passion of cocktails, it occurs to us to mix seasonal fruits and pair the experience with homemade ingredients. So, we take a bag of hibiscus tea, a wine glass, fill it with ice and pair a cava in the tea. To present it more





dramatically we look for slices of yellow lemons, and before we know it we have a wonderful cocktail, low in sugar, with a bright color and a citrus aroma that will perfume our table."

"For those who prefer a drink with a more masculine touch, you can look for a drink with more character such as rum, which mixed with apple juice and a cinnamon stick can feel the taste of Christmas in our mouths."

"Since at this time of the year we meet up with distant relatives who are usually there on important dates or occasions, I take out a tall glass, fill it with ice and add whiskey, a little ginger tea, honey and pineapple juice. Finally I top it with a pineapple leaf to make the cocktail look impressive and exuberant."

"If we have children of different ages that fill the home with joy, for them it is time for carols, mischief, games and creating unforgettable moments. 




How to choose a sophisticated and comfortable look




To Remember is to Live Again

When I think of Christmas weddings, how special and magical that moment is, my mind always goes to the decorations. It's not just the setting, it's the soul of the celebration, and in Central America, where traditions and holiday spirit are intertwined with so much meaning, flowers and details are what create that unforgettable atmosphere. I recently had a conversation with Francisco Luna, a floral master with a unique sensibility. From the very first moment, his approach and mine connected in a way that made talking about holiday decorating almost magical.

"More than creating, it's about being inspired by a concept," he tells me with a warm smile, as if revealing a secret. "A concept that allows the bride's ideas to be adapted to the Christmas season, where the color, the elements, everything fits what the bride dreams of for that special day. We can never forget that premise." And as I listened to him, I realized that what Francisco proposes is not just decoration, it is pure essence, a reflection of the soul of the couple and of the season.





I felt a deep connection with his vision. Francisco explained to me that his creative process is a mix of inspiration and the use of Christmas elements in a perfect balance, a 50/50, as he calls it. "It's what allows the bride's personality to shine through while the magic of Christmas comes through," he adds. And that's where I understood that, for him, every Christmas wedding is a blank canvas, ready to be painted with the couple's story.

We talked about materials, about the importance of the natural. "Natural elements are essential," he told me with a certainty that resonated with me. "Color creates a very strong visual impact, but it's the flowers and foliage that, even when simple, always bring freshness and elegance." His words made me think about how every decision, every flower he chooses, has such a clear purpose, so intentional, that everything feels deeply connected.

As the conversation progressed, Francisco and I immersed ourselves in the role of lighting. "Light changes everything," he told me, and I felt it. "Pin spots are critical.

It's not the same to see a floral arrangement under a soft light as it is to see it illuminated from the ceiling, highlighting its shapes and textures." In that moment, we both imagined that perfect wedding, with the white light illuminating the blue tones, or the warm light enveloping the reddish colors of the season. Every detail, from the light to the flower, comes to life as Francisco describes it, and I realize that we are totally aligned in our vision.

His love for local traditions also brought us together. "I always teach my students that the most important thing is to use what we have here, our flowers, our items," he explained to me. And that made me reflect on how, by incorporating those elements unique to our region, each wedding feels not only special, but grounded in our roots, in our culture.

When I asked him about his favorite flowers, I saw his eyes light up: "Pine, cypress, anthuriums, poinsettias, ginger, roses, dianthus. They all add a Christmas touch that can be as classic as it is modern." I loved the way he talked about flowers, with such affection, as if they were essential characters in the narrative of every wedding.





Near the end of our conversation, Francis shared a piece of advice that touched me deeply. "Before making a decision, I invite couples to do their research, to experience a Christmas in the place where they plan to get married. Christmas is a time for family, and that sentiment should be reflected in every detail." His view of Christmas, so intimate and personal, reminded me why I love what I do. Because it's about family, about connections, about creating something that lasts beyond the wedding day.

As I reflected on our talk, I realized that decoration is not simply aesthetics, it is a way of telling a story. Francisco and I share that passion, that need to make every wedding more than just an event, it's a reflection of love and tradition. This conversation left me even more inspired, and reminded me that, in every Christmas wedding, every detail counts to make that day unforgettable, something that will always remain in the hearts of those who live it.

In every celebration, whether it is a wedding, a family reunion or a social event, there is a corner that awakens smiles, memories and the desire to repeat: the dessert station. This carefully designed space is not only a delight for the palate, but a window to the heart of the traditions and stories that connect us with our loved ones. With my experience in events, I want to invite you to discover how to create a holiday dessert station that takes your guests back in time, evoking warmth, nostalgia and unique moments.

The magic of traditional desserts at Christmas, desserts are not just sweets; they are carriers of memories. Each country has its repertoire of delicacies that tell stories of family and culture, here are some of them:

In Ecuador, pristiños dipped in honey, hot chocolate with dried fruit cake, and gingerbread cookies decorated in Christmas tones are not to be missed. In Mexico, crunchy fritters are reminiscent of the festivities around the posadas (Christmas parties).

In Italy, panettone steals the show at every table; in Chile, Easter bread evokes family gatherings; and in France, the *bûche de* Noël, or yule log, combines flavor and elegance.

Each dessert is a key that opens the door to childhood memories, to moments shared with the family and the warmth of home.





Designing an Unforgettable Station

Whether for an intimate event or a large social celebration, a dessert station should feature elements that seduce both the eye and the palate. Here are some key suggestions:

Aesthetics: an Invitation to Remember.

Design your station with decorations that evoke warmth and magic. If you opt for traditional tones such as red and green, use gold bases and crystals to highlight the desserts. Alternatively, if you prefer a more rustic approach, include wooden details that evoke an enchanted woodland setting.

In this case, you can opt for gourmet desserts with a sophisticated presentation that will surprise guests, such as macarons with golden details, personalized chocolates or individual mini cakes.

This corner should not only be a gastronomic delight, but also a narrative experience: each dessert can tell a part of the host's story, his trips, traditions or personal tastes.

Nostalgia in Every Bite

Desserts have the unique ability to transport people back in time. Imagine your guests tasting a piece of dried fruit cake that reminds them of Christmas at their grandparents' house, or tasting *pristiños* that evoke afternoons in the kitchen with the family.
