#### A Sacred Place: Cenote Balam Ha in Akumal

This hidden paradise in the jungle of Akumal, in the Balam Ha cenote, was carefully chosen for the event. Surrounded by pure nature and in a location far from the hustle and bustle of civilization, Balam Ha offered a perfect blend of mystery and serenity. With an intimate space in the jungle and villas that could accommodate up to 28 people, Alejandra and Ricardo were able to immerse their 50 guests in a magical and timeless atmosphere.

#### An Ancestral Ritual to Connect Souls

The highlight of the wedding was an ancestral ceremony in the cenote, a spiritual Mayan Ceremony by @ancestralceremoniaespiritual. This ritual, full of symbolism and rooted in the ancient traditions of the region, transported everyone to a different energetic place. With incense, music and sacred words, Alejandra and Ricardo reaffirmed their love in a sacred space, while their guests experienced a deep connection with the local culture and nature that surrounded them.

#### Vegan Challenges and Local Cuisine

One of the biggest planning challenges was to fulfill the vegan vision of the bride and groom. The idea was to maintain respect for the traditional flavors of the region, but finding a vendor that offered authentic vegan and regional options was a challenge. Finally, @sinfoniaculinaria was hired to design a menu of unique and local dishes, accompanied by fruit infusions, teas and mezcal, providing attendees with a special culinary experience.

#### Details with History: Mexican Textile Art

The bride and groom's attire added another layer of authenticity and cultural pride to the wedding. Alejandra wore a dress designed by Yoloxochitl Alvarado, an Otomí textile artist, who hand embroidered a raised loin stitch typical of Zontecomatlán, Veracruz. Ricardo also wore a shirt embroidered with Nahua iconography, reflecting the couple's Mexican roots and their respect for art and tradition.

An innovative ambiance and decoration, here creativity flies! A unique color palette, mixtures of textures in tablecloths and furniture combined with a special taste to match the environment. We could not leave out as part of the ambiance the flowers and their accents combined to perfection to achieve a magical and unique atmosphere.

In planning a dream wedding, details such as live music, aromas in the atmosphere, food prepared on the spot, bars with designed drinks, and a schedule of special changing moments during the night, will leave a stamp of unforgettable memories.

Intimate and personalized details from the couple to their guests, such as a handwritten thank you letter or a unique place at the table are amazing. Special drinks to close guests, and expressing your collaboration to environmental sustainability with the support of technology and using electronic invitations, recyclable and eco-friendly materials.

## What inspired you to become part of the wedding world?

I was working as an interior designer and on different projects for several years, which for me was super dynamic and changing for every need and taste of each client. One afternoon, while I was sitting watching my youngest son's karate class, a friend of mine suggested me to design a wedding for her sister-in-law, who wanted something super special and non-traditional for her ceremony and in an outdoor location with lots of greenery.

I loved the challenge, I was inspired by the custom design from the space, lighting, table design, menu design and presentation, among others.

I was so happy at that moment to share the joy of celebration and be part of it that it was there where I began to apply interior design to the setting of events and weddings and everything they ask me to create an environment and a unique and special atmosphere.

## What has been the most memorable moment of your career so far?

In the course of these 20 years of work, there have been many... I will share some of them with you:

One challenges the those preparations for my voungest son's graduation party, for three thousand people in a convention center, and having to train my team to be a guest myself and enjoy that family moment and my job at the same time. Everything had to be perfect, there were many days of preparation beforehand, and a lot of vendors had to be coordinated!



Another important moment was the organization of a funeral of a great businessman, whose life left a great mark on our country. The funeral had to be in his factory and had to be prepared for two thousand five hundred people, who wanted to thank this great man for his help and work for several generations. There were a lot of logistics, but also a lot of detail as a great tribute, with family, friends and employees.

The most memorable moments of connecting with people in both good and bad times, and being able to help them get through them in the best way through my work is what leaves my heart full of joy and energy to keep going!

## Do you have a ritual or routine before each event?

It is usually the meal before we enter the final stretch of the assembly process. It's a time to laugh, share things together, make jokes about what might happen, and eat whatever my team wants or feels like eating. I always make sure they are having a good meal and that it gives them great energy for what lies ahead. Then we say a prayer before the event begins.

#### What is your favorite destination wedding?

I have several. It is difficult to choose one in particular. I would choose places that highlight the beauty of my country, such as the San Salvador Volcano, which is a place of forest and coffee estates, or the lake of Coatepeque which is located inside the crater of a volcano, which is impressive for all the guests who come to our country to have contact with nature. The white sand beaches and warm waters are an unforgettable experience as well.

## What advice would you give to a couple just starting to plan their wedding?

First of all, enjoy the process and remember that the wedding is a celebration of your love and your commitment to be with each other and build a life together.

As you begin this process, so that you both feel in harmony, (as there will be stressful moments), I recommend, agree on: a realistic financial investment, the number of guests with both families, and the style of the wedding. Above all, you should be flexible to enjoy every step, and you should always give yourself some time for you that is not all about wedding planning. And the most important recommendation: trust our planning and experience, as we will live every moment together with you in the best way.

## What is your favorite trend in weddings today?

The trend of freedom to individuality and creating the wedding in the style and manner of the bride and groom.

The rigid and traditional protocols where the parents chose absolutely everything under cultural norms, are no longer a priority and the bride and groom are the ones who decide. In this journey, I started working with the parents and now I barely get to know them before the wedding day.

Today's trend reflects a mix of individuality, sustainability and a focus on the guest experience. The commitment to the environment continues to grow, with more and more local vendors being chosen, recycled and biodegradable décor, and gifts becoming charitable donations.

The trend for outdoor weddings, especially in forests, mountains, beaches and lakes, is towards organic decoration, which is almost minimalist because the natural setting surrounds the wedding environment.



Another trend, which is very fashionable, is to offer food trucks, or food stations, and to offer various hours of food service.

Another strong trend is intimate weddings, for which the guests are selected in a very special way, and this way it is possible to have more special moments with the family. Everyone celebrates with the couple, emphasizing special food, good drinks and personalized music.

What is the most challenging thing about working in the wedding industry?

One of the most important challenges of working in the wedding industry is the great emotional charge involved. We are helping a couple plan one of the most important moments of their lives, which creates a lot of pressure and self-control.

Another big challenge is time management and logistics, since we have to coordinate vendors from different areas of work, guests, venues, decorations, among others. Maintaining flexibility and the ability to solve problems in the moment is extremely important.

And the last but not least challenge is to stay ahead of the curve. Wedding trends and styles are ever-changing, and it is very important to stay informed and attend congresses that enrich you with the knowledge of other experts. It is a necessary and permanent investment.

How to handle stress during the planning of a large event?

Managing stress in a large event is possible when all the previous planning work has been properly communicated to each of the vendors that are part of the event.

We are all part of the same team, we all want to be successful and have everyone talking about the excellent work done. Therefore, the final pre-event meeting with everyone involved is the most important. The schedule and details of each service are reviewed step by step.



Each vendor knows his job perfectly, and in this meeting each one can provide solutions for any unforeseen event that may occur.

The bond of trust created during the entire time prior to the event is of utmost importance, and delegating each activity and its responsibility to the team allows empathy and calm to be maintained, lowering the stress level.

Constant communication with the team and clients during the event allows needs to be quickly addressed and misunderstandings avoided.

Self-care, such as nutrition, taking breaks and proper hydration, helps to maintain energy and a clear mind.

And in the end, seeing the happiness of the bride and groom makes it all worthwhile!

What do you enjoy most about your work? The satisfaction of making the bride and groom's dreams come true.

Each wedding allows me to explore and combine styles. The creativity in the design of every detail and the materialization of all this process is a great satisfaction as a personal achievement.

I enjoy creating an emotional bond and connection with my clients. These bonds have lasted for years after the wedding! I have been able to organize other events such as baptisms and even first communions for these couples.

The entrance of the bride to the ceremony, giving her a few words to reassure her and feeling that connection of emotions, I feel it as a great honor to be part of that special moment.

### Do you have any mentors or inspirational figures in the industry?

Some of them would be: David Tutera, Mindy Weiss, Colin Cowie, Marcy Blum, Jasmine Star, Martha Stewart, Preston Bailey, among others.

They inspire me and update me on trends, and having met some of them in person fills me with great energy.

## How do you see the future of weddings in the coming years?

In the coming years, weddings will evolve significantly, adapting to trends of personalization and sustainability, as well as incorporating more and more technology and multicultural approaches.

Couples will be more focused on reducing the environmental impact of their weddings. This could include using recyclable materials, menus with local and seasonal foods, and eco-friendly locations. Decorations are also trending toward reusable or rented items rather than disposable.

Couples will be looking for personalized and more intimate experiences. They will focus more on quality than quantity of experiences for guests.

Technology will play an important role. Guests could interact through augmented reality or attend the wedding virtually from anywhere in the world.



With the increase in cross-cultural weddings, we will see an integration of multicultural traditions into ceremonies and receptions. This allows couples to honor their customs and offer their guests a rich and varied experience.





I guess you could call my story a classic dramatic break from tradition. I come from a family that values engineering as the ultimate achievement, with a clear career path that was practically mapped out for me. But from a very young age, I felt I was drawn in another direction. It wasn't engineering that was calling me, but photography, and it soon became impossible to ignore. I knew what I wanted to do and was rarely indecisive about my career, although others encouraged me to settle for a "safer" path. The world of art storytelling excited engineering felt like a set of rules to which I did not belong.

To the surprise, and perhaps some horror, of my family I decided to walk away from the path everyone assumed I would follow. I took a year to find myself and started working as an assistant to a Bollywood photographer. Those months were transformative. I completely immersed myself in the world of light, angles and visual storytelling. I learned to see moments in new ways and began to understand how a camera could capture something beyond what was visible on the surface. I felt like I was no longer just taking pictures, but framing emotions and stories.

After an amazing six months as an assistant, I decided to pursue a Bachelor's degree in Media to hone my craft and deepen my knowledge of the industry. In my second year, I was fortunate enough to intern as a photojournalist at The Indian Express.

That experience changed me: I discovered a love for portraits and the power they have to convey genuine, raw emotions. I was captivated by the idea of capturing the human spirit through my lens, understanding that each photograph could tell its own story.

At the end of college, I landed a position as a Senior Photojournalist at a lifestyle magazine, where I spent two years exploring the art of visual storytelling. My job wasn't just to take pictures; it was to really connect with my subjects and discover their essence. Each assignment gave me a new perspective, and I learned to embrace the unexpected and the spontaneous, qualities that would be invaluable in my later work.

Eventually, I made the decision to quit my job and dedicate myself to freelance photography. That was the turning point where I finally discovered my true calling: wedding photography. From the first wedding I covered, I knew I had found what I was meant to do. The emotions, the laughter, the tears, the celebration of love: it was a world that welcomed everything I loved about photography and storytelling. I was drawn to the authenticity of those moments, the spontaneous emotions and connections that went beyond smiles and rehearsed poses.

In November 2019, I joined PTaufiq Photography, a journey that has shaped me both personally and artistically. Through the experiences and mentorship I have received, I have continued to grow in my craft, honing my ability to capture love stories in a way that is significative and true to the essence of each couple.

What inspires me most about capturing love stories is the uniqueness of each couple's journey. No two love stories are the same, and I take the time to learn what makes each couple special. I get to know their tastes, their passions and the path that brought them together. For me, each session needs to reflect their individual story, which means deeply understanding their dreams and their connection. I believe I must fall in love with each couple's story in order to fully embrace it and translate it into images they will treasure forever.

Some sessions stay with me, like the session with Vidhi and Mohit in Jaipur. We captured them amidst Jaipur's rich heritage, where their personalities came alive against iconic backdrops. Dressed in traditional Indian attire, they embodied a timeless elegance that reflected the grandeur of Ameer and the charm of Fairmont. It was a session where their love became part of the environment, blending harmoniously with the beauty that surrounded them, and the result was a series of moments that felt authentic and unforgettable.

Each project is an experience, an intimate "table for two" where it's just me, my camera and a love story unfolding in real time. With each click, I feel privileged to be part of something deeply personal and significative. This is what motivates me to do what I do, because each love story continues to inspire me, reminding me that no two journeys are the same and that each one deserves to be captured with the same passion and heart.

Chapter Head Guatemala I Do, Guatemala, by Diana Sciarrillo @idoguatemala



With almost three decades of dedication to the design of social stationery, I can assure you that the bride and groom almost always state that invitations are very important in the wedding preparations. At the same time wedding planners consider them in many cases as an "outside" issue and do not include them as part of the "package". I, the designer, am probably the most passionate about this whole process and I usually spread my enthusiasm to my bride and groom and why not to the wedding planners.

Designing in the field of love is a privilege, it is a way of life, it induces you to pour affection and passion into every stroke, every color, every texture. I often ask myself: How do I let the wedding planners know that my art, charged with passion, can trigger a sense of happiness, can give more thirst for beautiful things and can slow down some fears so natural in the months leading up to the wedding?



The fact that the invitation is made and sent before the wedding does not mean that it is detached from it, on the contrary, the invitation is an essential announcement of the couple's love and how special the wedding will be.



With so much information on social media, the bride and groom may choose references that do not fit into the overall wedding proposal and, on the other hand, I, as a designer, must keep in mind that not everything I love will be loved by the bride and groom. This is where the artist's creativity comes in, not only as a talent in design, but also as an interpreter of the couple's emotions.


As everything must be aligned, I research in advance and during the whole process the floral proposals, Pantone colors, table linens, furniture finishes, place settings, cake decoration, among others, thus avoiding setbacks in the branding issue. But, above all, I cannot forget at any time the essence of the feelings that are the basis and inspiration for every detail of the wedding.



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It is ideal that the social stationery products created for the party (menu cards, table numbering, place cards, signage, among others) are made by the same professional who designs the invitation, thus achieving an emotional spectrum and an integrated graphic language. Personally, I also love to provide customized wireless luminaries that give a touch of magic to the spaces where they are placed.

As a work methodology in stationery, I recommend the virtual work table (WhatsApp group) that includes the designer, the wedding planner, the bride and groom and a coordinator; in the case of digital invitations and virtual reconfirmations, a programmer is added. In this way, everyone participates in real time in the progress of the work, mishaps or misunderstandings are avoided and the bride and groom will feel that they are in good hands.





In addition, the wedding planner participating in the group will have the opportunity to learn about the creativity and artistic talent in the stationery company, the quality, punctuality and the quality/price ratio.

Something unusual that I love to apply at Punto Celeste is to allow the bride and groom to enter the computer area and the craft workshops where there is no risk of accidents, thus offering them a unique experience. It's nice to see them excited and taking pictures.

My final recommendation is that the creator of invitations and social stationery should be trained in at least a basic wedding planner course, in order to better fulfill the function of inviting with grace, announcing with professionalism and offering attractive pieces that excite and delight the bride, groom and guests.

When we talk about weddings and marriages we usually tend to think that they refer to the same thing and this is not the case. The main difference between a wedding and a marriage is that a wedding is a ceremony or social event in which two people get married, while marriage is the legal status that is usually formalized through this type of event or ceremony.

A wedding can be a religious, civil or cultural ceremony. It is a public celebration in which the contracting parties exchange vows and promises in front of witnesses, and may include specific rituals and traditions, such as the exchange of rings, the reading of poems or religious texts, and the signing of a marriage contract or certificate.

On the other hand, marriage is a legal bond that recognizes the union of two people as spouses with long-term commitments; this legal union is performed before a judge, as it is a civil status recognized by the government and may have legal and financial implications, such as inheritance rights, tax benefits and shared legal responsibilities.

The concept of "egalitarian" is modern and refers to the people celebrating the





wedding or marriage being of the same sex or gender.

In the Dominican Republic, it is complicated to talk about egalitarian marriages, since until now this legal act can only be carried out between a man and a woman, leaving out the concept of "egalitarian".

In a country where same-sex marriage is still not recognized, each egalitarian wedding becomes a symbol of love, resistance and hope.

They met several years ago and since then their lives have been full of joy, shared growth and mutual support. Their decision to marry was both an act of love and conviction, a way to make equality visible in a country where many same-sex couples still face legal and social barriers.



"Avant-garde": a word resplendent in art, philosophy, design and literature. that, with bold ideas movement and unconventional approaches, breaks the boundaries of the familiar and questions traditions. In art, it makes colors and shapes dance together, merging functionality and aesthetics in design. In philosophy, it encourages us to think beyond the obvious and to question social structures. And the same happens in literature, by breaking with the commonplace and opening up new narratives.

But what do avant-garde principles look like when it comes to wedding planning and scenic design? Is it about the planner's stylistic identity here? About the personality and DNA of the bride and groom, which materializes architecturally? Who influences whom? Which visions are implemented – those of the planner or those of the client?





In wedding planning there is a wide range of styles to be developed. At the extreme end of minimalism, for example, the famous interior designer Vincent van Duys embodies and clarity. His designs are elegance characterized by simple lines and a reduced color palette, conveying calm, silence and balance. A wedding concept following this approach could be staged with soft tones and clear shapes to create an atmosphere of serenity. Very coherent, and contemporary.

Equally coherent and contemporary, but completely opposite, is maximalism, as represented by Alessandro Michele, the former creative director of Gucci and now Valentino. Pure opulence. Maximum exaggeration. A wedding in this spirit of maximalism might feature lush vivid arrangements, colors and extravagant tableware, generating a sense of abundance and celebration.

In times of eclecticism, where many styles flourish in parallel and have simultaneous validity, there is no right or wrong. There is not THE trend, THE method, THE way. The advantage of our age lies in the fact that our artistic freedom has no restrictive limits. Styles such as Boho-Chic, Japandi, Art-Deco, Modern Glam or Beach House, all have their reason for being, as long as they remain conceptually strong, coherent and careful in every detail of the planning.

The challenge always lies in orchestrating each element of a wedding so that it culminates in an emotional climax. Gertrude Stein said, "In a menu there must be a progression and a climax. Handle this with care. One will suffice." Every detail - from the décor to the food selection to the music - should form a harmonious unit, translating the couple into a space, into a table decoration, into a total work of art that attracts and envelops the guests. A classic narrative, with prologue, development, climax and epilogue.






Iconic fashion figure Diana Vreeland always emphasized in her role as hostess: "You gotta have style, without style you are nothing". This knowledge is particularly relevant to weddings, where the concept is the personal style of the couple, of the planner, and so the total experience is shaped. A total work of art, composed in all its aspects, speaking its own language, can transport, tell stories, create worlds and transform emotions into memories.

It requires creative sensitivity and, above all, courage for the planner to embrace the unexpected. To be the key to an avant-garde masterpiece - and avant-garde, literally translated, is to be the first of its kind, a beacon, an idol, the front rank that many will follow. It's about breaking the boundaries of what is possible and exploring new stylistic and conceptual territories. Everything is possible. The sky is not the limit, the mind is. We, the planners, the designers, composers, want to create something that impresses, that fascinates. And that, in its uniqueness, is unforgettable. As unique as the couple itself.

When it is a high altitude destination, you should tell them that they can arrive a few days earlier to acclimatize, drink coca tea and fully enjoy the place.







In this specific case it can be by land being 8 hours the time from Lima to Huaraz and also by air, since in July of this year we had the pleasant news that the Anta Airport was inaugurated. It is located in the province of Carhuaz, province of Ancash, thousands of Peruvians foreigners will have the opportunity to arrive in only 45 minutes.

Here we can take the opportunity to promote a good culinary experience where the ingredients are harvested by the farmers themselves and brought to your wedding menu. Can you imagine having a *raspadillas* station and that the ice is from the Huascarán snow-capped mountain?

By having a destination wedding we can economically help many local vendors, from the food that you will eat in your wedding menu, souvenirs made by communities of the Callejón de Huaylas, travel agencies for your icebreaker or your post wedding, transportation (airport - venue - airport), hotels with special rates for your guests, among others.

The bride and groom who wish to have a destination wedding are the great ambassadors of their wedding and that makes it become not just another event, but an experience for their guests.

In these 8 years that I have been working as a destination wedding planner in Peru, it has been very exciting to travel around our country thanks to brides and grooms eager






to show their guests their roots, their customs and their homes.



## Photographing Weddings in Chilean Patagonia

By definition, a destination wedding occurs when the bride and groom decide to get married in a location other than where they live, which involves moving them, their guests and all the logistics to that destination. So, is it enough to be present at that location to be a destination wedding photographer?

I'm Caro Hepp, destination wedding photographer, and with my experience I can answer: definitely not! In this article, I will tell you what it means to be a destination wedding photographer in Chilean Patagonia.

I have lived in Puerto Varas, Región de Los Lagos, since 2015, and here I have photographed more than 150 destination weddings. When I started, the term "destination wedding" wasn't even used; it was simply a wedding in nature. Without realizing it, I started attracting brides and grooms looking for a natural setting because of the images I shared. That's how I became a destination wedding photographer.





Throughout my experience, I have found that people choose a destination primarily for two reasons: because the place is beautiful or because they have an emotional attachment to it, or both. The first thing I do is discover that bond and get to know the couple, who tend to be nature and outdoor lovers and have an adventurous personality.

However, many couples do not have a thorough knowledge of the destination where they plan to get married. Here it is essential that a destination wedding photographer knows, understands and manages the natural light and climate of the area. Chilean Patagonia is a challenge: weddings here are long and photographers often start early to take advantage of the light and environment, which means being ready to shoot in different weather conditions in a matter of minutes.



In addition, the southern weather is changeable and requires flexibility both in planning and in the attitude of the bride, groom and vendors. Since living in Puerto Varas, I have learned to "embrace the weather", going through sun, rain, hail and rainbows in the same day. For a wedding, this means having alternative plans and an open attitude.

Another important element is the visual essence of these weddings: exploiting the beauty of the location and the nature surrounding the bride and groom. My approach, perhaps influenced by my experience as an athlete, is to be an "all terrain" photographer, ready to walk, climb or even enter the water to capture the best image. I work alone, always looking for spontaneous photos and avoiding highly staged poses. The best shots often emerge in those unforeseen moments.

My personality and energy also play a key role, giving me the confidence to organize and lead groups, and even to adjust the program when the landscape gives us something special, such as a sunset or a rainbow. Thus, I can convince brides, grooms and wedding planners to take advantage of those unique moments to create unforgettable memories.

A couple's session should be more than posing; it's about creating an intimate space where the bride and groom can forget about





the camera and live a special and authentic moment. I seek to capture real laughter and looks of love, and that requires experience and empathy.

That's what it means to be a destination wedding photographer. That's me, Caro Hepp: passionate, versatile, with tireless creativity, always looking for the perfect shot. My style is a mix of documentary and subtle direction, and my editing is all about natural colors and clean aesthetics. With over 30 years of experience, and 10 years in weddings, I am honored to have awards such as the Fearless Award and the Wedding Award (2020–2024). Currently Top #5 Chile ProWed. Top #10 Chile Mywed.

My next amazing destination: Easter Island in May 2025. My dream destinations: Torres del Paine, Coyhaique, Elqui Valley, San Pedro de Atacama and the Caribbean beaches.

I encourage all brides and grooms to choose a wedding destination and work with local vendors who understand how to get the most out of that location. Don't skimp on choosing a good photographer: your memories are priceless and will be the only thing that will keep your big day alive.

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There's something magical about the details. In the world of luxury events, where every element counts, tablescaping has become one of the most powerful ways to tell the bride and groom's story. It's not just a well-assembled table; it's the creation of an environment that invites connection, where every piece -from the furniture to the most finest accessories- plays its part in a visual and sensory symphony.

I had the opportunity to talk with Karin Andrea Odoñer, from Tablescape, and Otto Recinos, from Fileas, two professionals passionate about bringing these stories to life through their art. What excited me the most was to realize that we share the same vision: every wedding should be unique, reflecting the personality and dreams of the bride and groom, while creating an experience that guests will not forget.

As a planner, my job starts with a thorough understanding of what the bride and groom want to convey on their big day. As a planner, my job begins with a thorough understanding of what the bride and groom want to convey on their big day. What emotions do they want to evoke?





What moments do they want their guests to remember forever? After capturing that essence, my mind begins to design a global vision, where every detail comes to life in harmony. And this is where the real magic begins: by sharing that vision with experts like Karin and Otto, together we transform every idea into a tangible reality.

Furniture is one of the first key elements we select. It's not just about choosing chairs and tables; it's about finding pieces that connect with the style of the wedding and, at the same time, create a cozy atmosphere. Once this is defined, we work closely with our tableware and accessories suppliers, such as Karin Andrea Odoñer, to select the elements that will take the design to the next level.

"Accessories are much more than just decorative details," Karin explained to me. "They are the finishing touches that bring the table to life, adding texture, color and character. From base plates to goblets to candles, each piece is meant to create a unique visual and sensory experience."

And that's precisely what makes tablescaping so special: attention to detail. The careful choice of colors and textures not only complements the furnishings but brings a perfect balance.

Karin explained it brilliantly, "The key is harmony. Each accessory should have its own space on the table, not competing with the other elements, but complementing them."

Then, with the design well underway, I was thrilled to share that vision with Otto Recinos. Talking with him was an eye-opening experience, as we both share a deep passion for creating tables that are not only visually stunning, but also tell a story. Otto has a unique talent for transforming each table into a small play:

"Every element on the table has a role to play, and my job is to make sure all those elements work together in perfect harmony," he told me. "Flowers, candles, textiles, everything must be in balance, with no single detail stealing the spotlight."

Together we visualize each wedding as a symphony where the planner is the conductor, and each vendor brings their own instrument to make it all flow. A prime example of this collaboration was a recent wedding where, with rustic chic furnishings, we added vibrant tableware that added a fresh, modern touch. Local details and small personalized touches made each guest feel part of something very special.





What excites me most about this process is how each element has the power to tell a story. Otto describes it best: "Tablescaping is like an orchestra. If every instrument plays in harmony, the result is an unforgettable experience for everyone."

In the end, what really makes a wedding stand out are those little personalized details. Karin was clear when she said, "Little touches, like place cards or unique napkin rings, make guests feel like everything has been thought of especially for them." And that's what really makes a wedding stick in the memory of the guests.

Tablescaping, then, is not just the decoration of a table. It is the heart of the celebration. It's what unites guests around a common experience, creating an environment where emotions, stories and details come to life. And when everything flows in harmony, from the furniture to the last accessory, the wedding becomes something more: it becomes an indelible memory.

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

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
