Cuisine is one of the most important features of an event; I think we all agree that every dish that is served at a celebration will show the guests how special they are to their hosts.

If you have decided to have a destination wedding, allow the local flavors to be part of the gastronomy of your celebration. A snack, a special dish, a dessert or even a drink served in a unique way will be a pleasant experience that will highlight the event.

I always recommend to the bride and groom that at a destination wedding it is best to use the flavors and seasonings of the special place they have chosen for their celebration. This will give it a different touch and make everything fresher. If you select a beach place, ideally the food should be fish or seafood; it would be very strange to take your guests to a place on the coast for a grill menu or *asados*, as they are called in other countries.

The typical dishes of each country give the touch of connection with the destination. In Colombia, for example, a *Bandeja Paisa* will express to your guests the authenticity of serving an emblematic dish of the country; and if your guests come from other latitudes, it is a great way to show them how complete this popular dish from the department of Antioquia is and which is generally enjoyed throughout Colombia.


Ceviche is a dish very typical of Peruvian gastronomy; however, it has become popular and is prepared in different ways in many countries, adding ingredients from each region to create unique experiences for the diners who taste it.



We have had at our weddings and events a gastronomic station "Ceviche Bar" where even vegan ceviche is served using hearts of palm or mushrooms as a base instead of fish as the usual protein. For example, it is very common for a coastal area to serve a ceviche and present it decorated; it can be in a large clam shell or even a coconut shell if that flavor is incorporated as an additional ingredient.

A destination wedding or event invites us to soak up the destination, live it and enjoy it with all 5 senses. Local flavors are essential for this to happen; seasonings, fruits and ancestral recipes make a culinary preparation an experience that travels and stays in the guest's memory.





The way we serve a dish is sometimes the distinctive touch, a seal that makes the difference and often complements the flavor of the delicious food served there. For example: in Venezuela and Colombia there are several recipes that are made wrapped in banana leaves, *hallacas*, tamales and a very complete dish called *Fiambre*, which is served a lot in the coffee region of Colombia. This unique dish consists of rice, meat, chicken, eggs, potatoes, plantains and chorizo, all cooked and wrapped in banana leaves. This leaf gives it a unique flavor that characterizes it and also makes the presentation look lovely.

A few months ago on Margarita Island in my beloved Venezuela, I tasted a spectacular octopus; the secret was cooking it in a clay *anafre*. The *anafre* is a kind of stove that contains embers that heat the casserole,



frying pan or grill. In addition to cooking, it keeps the food warm while it is brought to the table to be served. Undoubtedly, the taste of the octopus prepared with this technique was a real experience.

It happens usually that the most representative and autochthonous flavors of a region are not in the hands of a chef or sophisticated cooks trained in the best schools, and it is not even common in the most renowned hotels and catering services. However, we planners do a good scouting and in many cases we make great work plans for the catering and service to support the Creole hands that create those magical feasts full of archetypal memory in every bite.

To the industry's delight, many talents from these areas and the great chefs have been catching on to this trend because of the



richness hidden in the ancestral gastronomy of each country, rather than because of fashion. They have discovered seasonings, condiments and techniques that in many cases are often rudimentary, but are full of wisdom. They have also achieved incredible banquets not only for their flavors, but also for their picturesque presentations, which in many cases are accompanied by wonderful stories and performances.

Don't miss the opportunity to impress your guests with the flavors and seasonings of the place you have selected for your wedding. It will be a unique culinary experience that will make them remember your wedding.



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As a professional makeup artist specializing in bridal makeup in Cartagena de Indias, the capital of marriages and brides, I have learned that bridal makeup is an art that balances the ephemerality of trends with timelessness. This ensures that a bride looks stunning today, tomorrow and decades from now when she relives her big day through photos and videos.

My philosophy is based on understanding trends without leaving aside the classic essence of bridal makeup. In 2025, we continue to see the rise of the "clean look": luminous, fresh and natural skin, but with a more semi-matte and hydrated approach. Excessively moisturized skin is being left behind, as in photographic records and in humid climates like Cartagena, it is no longer flattering.





As for colors, mocha and mauve tones are on trend. The "rosewood" becomes an ideal option for fair-skinned women or blondes, bringing sweetness and sophistication. Elaborate eyes are back with a vengeance, but we are moving away from sharp eyeliner and very defined strokes, and choosing blurring that enhances the look without hardening the features.

Hairstyle is also evolving. Although the updo is still a reliable choice, this 2025 we see more relaxed versions with the sleek back effect. The loose hair trend is still booming, but in humid climates like ours, I always recommend choosing a second look with a touch up to keep the freshness throughout the event.



Key tips for a perfect bridal makeup: For the makeup to stay flawless throughout the event, I recommend moisturizing the skin well the days before, opt for a longfoundation and lasting set with translucent powders in key areas. Don't to use waterproof products, forget especially on the eyes, to handle the emotions of the big day. Finally, test your makeup beforehand to make sure you feel completely comfortable and confident with the final result.





Every bride is unique and, as a makeup artist, beyond following trends, my goal is to make her feel beautiful and confident on her big day. I believe that there are two types of brides when it comes to makeup: those who prefer a natural and luminous look, and those who go for a more sophisticated and glamorous style. My job is to listen, understand her tastes and guide her in the creation of a look that makes her feel like herself at her best.

Bridal makeup is much more than a combination of products and techniques. It is the possibility to capture her essence, to make her feel special and to give her the confidence to live her day to the fullest. Because trends come and go, but what a bride feels when she looks in the mirror on her big day is what really lasts through the years.
